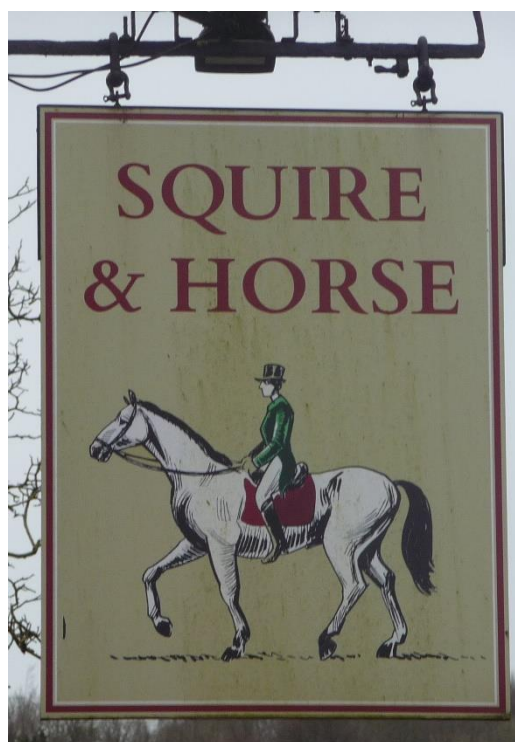
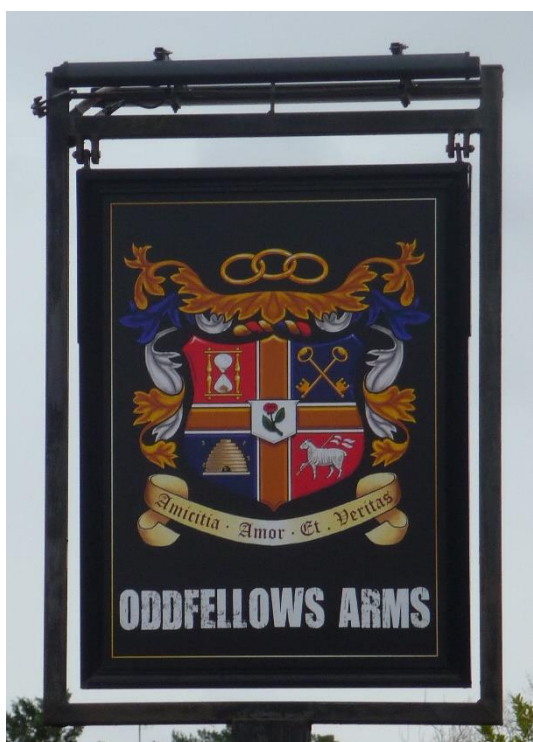
Following the Agenda overleaf there will be a talk by Dr Janet Pennington entitled
