as usual in the Village Hall

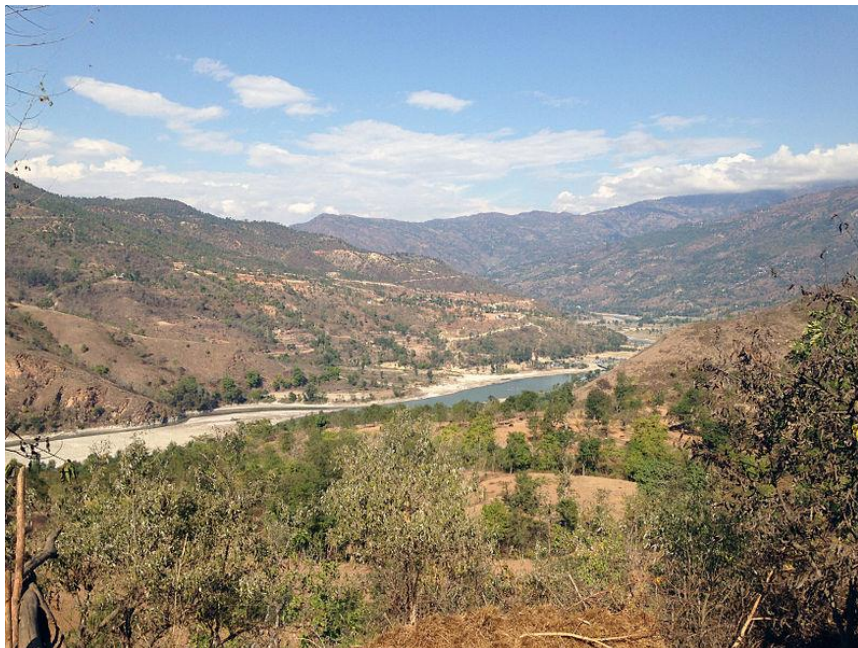
This next meeting is all about the Church Archaeology of the Arun Valley.
